1. CAPABILITY & CAPACITY FUND

The National Executive has revisited the distribution of the fund and determined the use of the remaining funds for 2021/2022FY and the allocation of the 2022/2023 FY fund.

KAUPAPA FOR 2021/2022 FUND

The remaining funds from the 2021/2022 will be utilised for four purposes:

1. **MWWL and Te Whare Wananga o Awanuiarangi Te Pou Hono programme:** To support the administration, implementation, co-ordination, and resources for the programme.

2. **National Affiliations:** Every branch that paid their national affiliations for 2021/2022 will have their national affiliations paid for 2022/2023. All branches will still be required to pay their affiliations by 30 June 2023 as usual, which will affiliate them in advance for the 2023/2024 financial year. Payment of affiliations in advance will become the norm, which will alleviate pressures around financial year end for our audit and will also allow us to have branches pay their affiliations before the financial year begins and not when it ends as has been the case for many years.

3. **Regional Affiliations:** A contribution of \$5,000 will be given to each region to pay for regional affiliations for branches. Any outstanding costs not covered by the contribution will be left to the region to manage with their branches.

4. **National Strategy Roadshow:** To support the National Executive to deliver our National Strategy.

Feasibility/Research: To support purposeful feasibility/research of future kaupapa.

KAUPAPA FOR 2022/2023 FUND

Funds for 2022/2023 will be utilised for:

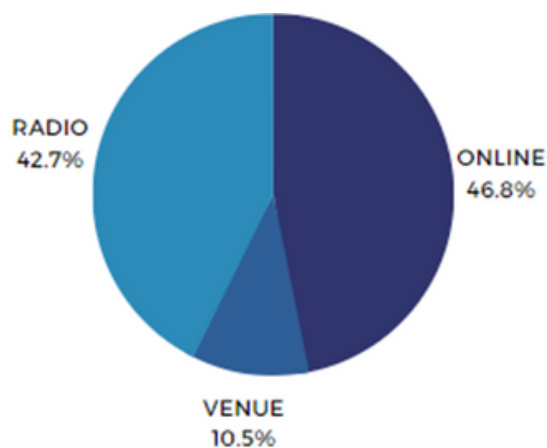
1. **Te Pou Hono Programme with Te Awanuiarangi:** Co-ordinate and administer programme for members.

2. **Regional Fund:** Each regional executive will receive \$30,000 to build their capability and capacity for their members. Perth branch will also receive funds. The funds will be distributed to Regional Councils by the end of September 2022.

3. **Feasibility/Research:** To support purposeful feasibility/research of future kaupapa.

2. HAUORA PROMOTION

Our branches engaged with over 140,000 whanau and community for the 2021/2022 Hauora Promotions. A great response to the COVID restrictions in place as our branches took to the radio and online channels to increase our engagement as follows:



OUR HAUORA FOCUS

Our focus continues to be Immunisation, Healthy Homes and Auahi Kore. Immunisation rates remain low for tamariki Māori shown in the statistics of those fully immunised by age group for the three month period of April 2022 to June 2022 are:
